Background Information:

This lesson is the fourth lesson in the integrated unit on Global Water Awareness. Students are introduced to an additional way to do research on a topic through the internet.

Teaching/Learning Sequence:

INTRODUCTION: Show short clips <u>http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BkNY78B2Jio</u> <u>http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=wXR4Z_NBD-E</u>

LAST CLASS we continued to read non-fiction material and used shapes to guide our reading and we learned another strategy THIEVES.... – review strategies and steps.

BRIEF review of Shapes Summary Structure and steps to preview non-fiction. Pre-made flipchart of steps used previously.

EXEMPLAR of student completed 'shapes summary structure' on overhead. Read with class.

NOTE: GOAL – 3 articles per person.

INTRODUCE: website research using same organizer with slight modification....identification of title of website and address.

ASK students.....what are some of the things to consider when looking at sites on the internet?

BRAINSTORM on flip-chart

MODEL looking at a website and project on screen.

EXAMPLE of shapes summary structure completed (in advance) for website.

TASK students continue to work on summary structure and reading of nonfiction. 2 articles must be completed before internet research. Remember that the goal is to read 3 articles. Once two are completed, you can begin internet research and an option is to do the third article for homework.

HANDOUT previously completed structures and internet research organizer for those who are ready.

PRE-MADE list of websites to visit for those students who are ready for internet research. Also encourage further searching. These are simply sites to get started with.
